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they use in their dealings with others, so they have many friends who cherish the same ideas and follow the same path. No matter how many friends a true junzi has, they will always be like oxygen in the air we breathe, making their friends feel happy and cared for. The Chinese character, for 'enter into cliques' looks like two people standing close together. This means that petty people prefer to get together in their own little cliques, they don't like to be absorbed into the big collective. For example, at a party a junzi will feel completely at ease with everyone there, whether old friends or strangers; but a petty person will skulk in a corner with their best friend, the two of them muttering away to each other, as thick as thieves. Why are there such differences between people?

Again, it is because the junzi and the petty do not exist in the same moral state. Confucius said: 'The junzi is easy of mind, while the small man is always full of anxiety.' (Analects vii) The reason why the petty are often found conspiring with others is that they have an uneasy conscience, and want to plot for their own advantage and protect what they already have. When we talk about cronyism or forming cliques this is exactly what we mean. The mind of the junzi, on the other hand, is contented and composed; because he or she is in a state of peace. In China, we have always regarded harmony as a thing of beauty, but what is true harmony?

Confucius repeatedly shows us it is a tolerance towards others, a kind of melding and mingling, all the while maintaining different voices and different viewpoints. This is the way of the junzi in society. Because there are so many differences between a junzi and a petty individual, you will find your dealings with them will be very different. Confucius said: 'The junzi is easy to serve but difficult to please. He will not be pleased unless you try to please him by following the Way, but when it comes to employing the services of others, he does so within the limits of their capacity. The small man is difficult to serve but easy to please. He will be pleased even though you try to please him by not following the Way, but when it comes to employing the services of others, he demands all-round perfection.' Confucius explains these differences in a way that is extremely easy to understand, because he always puts the junzi and the petty side by side in order to compare them.
