An important and powerful method is called perturbation theory that refers to any situation in which a solution to an equation is analyzed by using an existing nearby solution as a reference, or even possibly by solving a nearby equation rather than the original equation. In order for perturbation theory to be applicable, one or more of the following items should be true: (i) The desired initial data should be close to the reference equation. (iii) The time interval on which the analysis is performed should be small. In this chapter you are guided to learn a very useful method: time-independent perturbation theory for bound states.

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
